

Threatened plants of the Granite Belt

Homoranthus inopinatus



Conservation status

- Critically endangered – Qld (NC Act 1992)

Description

- Erect shrub to 1.4 m.
- Leaves:
 - measure 15 mm long
 - dull pale green
 - narrow and lance-shaped
 - side view is straight or curved.

Flowers and fruit

- Flowers:
 - tubular, occurring singly in the leaf axils
 - pale yellow to green, turning red as they age.
- Flowering occurs from October to December.
- Fruit a capsule containing 1-2 winged seeds.

Habitat and distribution

- Endemic to the Granite Belt.
- Recorded from Doctor's Creek at Ballandean.
- Found in woodland on exposed granite.
