

Threatened plants of the Granite Belt

Kardomia silvestris (Woodland kardomia)



Conservation status

- Vulnerable – Qld (NC Act 1992)

Description

- Shrub to 2.5m.
- Bark grey and fibrous.
- Leaves:
 - oval-shaped with a rounded tip
 - margins entire
 - measures 3-4.5mm x 1.5-3.3mm.

Flowers and fruit

- Flowers:
 - white and solitary
 - hypanthium smooth, stamens 8-10.
- Flowers sporadically over several months.
- Fruit a capsule containing flattened D-shaped seeds.

Habitat and distribution

- Recorded from Bald Mountain and north-east of Castle Rock in Girraween National Park.
- Found on granite outcrops that provide a fire refuge.
