

Threatened plants of the Granite Belt

Acacia torringtonensis (Rupp's wattle)



Conservation status

- Vulnerable – Qld (NC Act 1992)
- Endangered – Federal (EPBC Act 1999)

Description

- Low shrub with ribbed stems.
- Flat phyllodes 8–25 mm.
- Juvenile bipinnate leaves at base.

Flowers and fruit

- Flowers:
 - bright yellow spherical heads
 - short racemes.
- Flowering occurs from August to October.
- Fruit comprises a 3-9 cm pod, flat and twisted.

Habitat and distribution

- Recorded from:
 - Amosfield Rd
 - Girraween National Park.
- Found in heathy open forests and woodlands.
