

Control of Vines and Scramblers

Examples of vines include: • balloon vine, morning glory, honeysuckle, cape ivy, jasmine, madeira vine, blackberry



METHODS OF REMOVAL

Take hold of one runner and gently pull STEP 1 it along the ground towards you.

> Check points of resistance where fibrous roots grow from the nodes. Cut roots with a knife or dig out with a trowel and continue to follow the

> > The major root systems need to be removed manually or scrape/cut and

Bag any reproductive parts.






Aerial tubers on madeira vine should die with the plant when stem scraping is used. Those that fall from the plant in the scraping process need to be bagged.

Vines can be left hanging in trees after treatment.
